Walk with Clinton's Greatest

The Clinton Walk of Fame gives community members and visitors an interesting and innovative way to showcase individuals who planted their roots in our county. The Walk of Fame serves the purpose of giving inspiration to all generations from our community to make a difference and to shed a positive light on Clinton County through their achievements, just like the nominated individuals have done.

Individuals can be nominated for the following five categories:

- Fine Arts
- Professional Achievement
- Military
- Athletics
- Humanitarian Acts

A nominee for the Walk of Fame must have been born in or lived in Clinton County and have made an impact locally or elsewhere in the nation or abroad. The nominee should have values and characteristics that demonstrate a significant positive impact in their fields or to Clinton County.

The nomination includes a completed nomination form and an essay (maximum of 500 words) with evidence of how the nominee fits into the category with emphasis on their connection to Clinton County. Additional evidence materials, such as newspaper articles, awards, etc. are encouraged to be included.

Members of the nomination committee will be chosen by the Clinton Hometown Pride Committee. The nomination committee will consist of people living in Clinton County and active in community affairs and are not required to be a member of the Clinton Hometown Pride Committee. Also, eligible are members of the Clinton High School Synergy program.

Nominations are accepted any time. When the deadline for the current year is passed, the nomination will be considered for the following year. The application process opens on the second Monday of January. The deadline for 2023 is February 17, 2023 (4:30pm). The nominations will be reviewed by the committee and the selections will be announced at the April meeting of the Hometown Pride Committee. Those selected for the honor will be submitted to the Clinton City Council for approval. Recognition will be held in September. The committee will notify the nominee or their family of their selection.

Nominations may be made without any contact information for the nominee or the nominee's next of kin. If no contact information is known for the nominee or their next of kin, please leave section two and three blanks of the nomination sheet.
